ABOUT JOHN MERCER LANGSTON

The Association is named after John Metror Langston (December 14, 1829 - November 15, 1897) who was an American isolitionist and U.S. Congressman from Virginia. He was one of the first African Americans in the United States to be elected to public office when in 1855, he was elected as a town clerk in Ohio.

Langton was born a slave in Lovius County, Virginin. His parents died when he was five years old and Langton was freed in compliance with his finder's wishes. Langton them moved to Oberlin, Ohio, and enrolled in Oberlin Gollege at the rag of Fouriers, where he camed both a bothelor's and master's degree. Langton inter applied to Albary Law School, and was deviced damission due so his real. Langtons tunded to under attempt Politimen Bliss and became a member of the Ohio har in 1854. He was the first African American to be so admitted and later became a member of the Virginis bar so well.

Langton moved to Washington, D.C. in 1868 to establish and sorte as Doan of the Howard University School of Law, the first African-American law school in the country. He became president of the suchool in 1877, Pusition III Uses S. Gent appointed Langton a member of the District of Columbia Board of Health, and he was elected its secretary in 1875. In 1877, he resigned to become U.S. minister to Hairi. He returned to Virginia n 1885, and was the first president of Virgina Deemal and Collegate Institute (tow Virginia State University).

In 1883, Langston ran for a seat in the U.S. House of Representatives as a Republican. He lost to his Democrace opponent, but contested the results of the election. After an 18-month flight, he was declared the winner and awarded the Congressional Sear. He served for the remaining six months of the term. Langston was the first African American elected to Congress from Virginia, and the was the only one for another century.

After a lifetime of firsts and numerous historical accomplishments, Langston died in his Washington home on November 15, 1897, John Mercer Langston was the uncle of world-resowned poet, Langston Hughes (born James Mercer Langston Hughes - named after his uncle).

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
